III. Goals for the Ensemble.

- Heartfelt music-making
- Growth-focused literature
- Community-centered rehearsals

IV. Participation Expectations.

- Engage in all rehearsals.
- Attend all scheduled rehearsals and performance(s).
- Communicate unavoidable absence prior to requested absence date.
- Read all documents posted in Canvas which support ensemble membership.

V. Schedule Rotation Options.

- a. The ensemble will be divided into two groups (A and B).
 - i. Normal weekly rehearsal will be group A on one day and group B on the other.
 - ii. Periodically, we will rehearse as a <u>full ensemble</u> in Escher Auditorium on Wednesdays.
 - iii. The Thursday rehearsal following full ensemble work will include **both group A and group B rehearsals**.
- b. Once classroom space details have been finalized as a department, a schedule will be posted and entered into the calendar within Canvas.
- VI. Personal Safety (supporting results from the *International Performing Arts Aerosol Study*).
 - a. PPE issued to all students.
 - i. Musicians face mask for all brass and woodwind members.
 - ii. Bell covers for all instruments.
 - iii. Puppy pads for all brass instruments.
 - b. Rehearsal room occupancy limitations
 - i. D-040 will have a **maximum occupancy** of 28 students.
 - ii. <u>Chairs will be</u> distanced from each other to diminish any aerosols that escape from either the musicians mask or the bell covers.
 - iii. <u>Limited rehearsal time</u> of 30 minutes will be followed by us leaving the room for an aeration break.

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- c. Procedures which support reduced aerosol spread.
 - i. Place your musicians <u>mask on your face before</u> entering the rehearsal room.
 - ii. <u>Enter and exit</u> through specific doors to the rehearsal room for a "one way" traffic pattern.
 - iii. Wait until all members are in the room prior to beginning to warm-up.

VII. Access To Improvement Opportunities.

- a. Professor Campbell
 - i. **Schedule a lesson** session with him (if possible, during his office hours).
 - ii. Focus should be on musical challenges <u>relating to the music</u> in our folders.
- b. Instrument specialists within our faculty.
 - i. Every instrument has a <u>highly qualified faculty member</u> who is able to work with you over the semester.
 - ii. Studying with a faculty member can heighten your enjoyment in Symphonic Band by giving you <u>more tools for success</u> on your instrument.

VIII. Steps To Starting In Symphonic Band.

- a. Register for MUSC 230 for either 1 credit or 0 credit.
- b. Communicate with either <u>Dr. Bruce Thornton</u> (woodwinds) or <u>Dr. Justin Zanchuk</u> (brass) for renting a school instrument.
- c. Our first rehearsal will guide everyone through getting your PPE, your instrument locker, and your music folder.
- d. Flutes, Clarinets, Alto Saxes, Trumpets, and Trombones will need to do a part assignment demonstration. (material and details posted in Canvas)
- e. First rehearsal with music, part assignments and instruments will be Wednesday or Thursday, February 3 or 4.
